

Approach regarding athletes before and after the Games
(at Host Towns, pre-Games training camps)
(Draft | Subject to discussion and study)

【Provisional Translation】

Regarding the Host Towns and pre-Games training camp sites, can we discuss and study the following framework?

1. The Government of Japan (Secretariat of the Headquarters for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games, Cabinet Secretariat) will develop a "Sample Guide for the Preparation of Reception Manuals" (tentative name) and request the municipalities welcoming athletes to prepare their own "Reception Manual" which specifies infection prevention measures that will be taken in the Host Town and at pre-Games training camp sites.

2. The same approach will be taken with regard to the pre-Games training camp sites for Japanese athletes. It will be necessary to establish a system that enables us to secure an understanding of the situation of pre-Games training camp sites that are not Host Towns; we do not yet have a comprehensive understanding of these sites.

3. These considerations will required detailed discussion with the IOC, the IPC, NOC/NPCs, IFs, etc.

Items	Policy
Travel Routes	○ Domestic travel routes including to/from Host Town and pre-Games training camp sites should be registered. Regarding training camp sites that are not Host Towns, the associated municipalities will be encouraged to register as "Host Towns" to ensure a common approach.
Travel (To/from outside of the Host Towns)	○ Based on the results of the discussions at the Coordination Meeting ("(3) Rules regarding Transport"), and following consultation between each municipality and the NOC/NPC or national federation of the respective country or region whose athletes it will receive, the means of transportation and the travel routes between airports and Host Towns and between Host Towns and the Olympic and Paralympic Village will be decided. The following measures should also be taken: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Formulation of travel route plans • Formulation of infection prevention measures according to the means of transport (e.g. rules governing the boarding of airplanes and bullet trains, procedures at transfer locations, and behavior at service areas and parking areas on highways) • Identification of issues regarding those who come into close contact with athletes (e.g. whether prior health management and COVID-19 testing for interpreters, guides, drivers of special-purpose vehicles, etc. are necessary or not.)
Training	○ Regarding competition venues and the Olympic and Paralympic Village, the following measures should be taken: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Formulation of infection prevention measures in dedicated venue facilities (e.g. locker rooms and shower rooms, etc.) • Identification of areas that need to be considered outside of the areas dedicated for athletes' use (e.g. toilets) and formulation of infection prevention measures • Designation of pedestrian traffic lanes to facilitate distancing • Formulation of measures to be taken by training partners, training assistants, referees, and other staff • Formulation of measures for handling the media, audiences, etc., during open practices • Formulation of measures reflecting the specific characteristics of each event (disinfection of tools, floors, etc.)
Mingling of/with athletes	○ Appropriate measures should be implemented to prevent infection, in consultation with the NOC/NPC or national federation of the respective country or region whose athletes that municipality accepts, referring to the "New Lifestyle" guidance and related industry-specific guidelines.
Accommodation	○ Regarding the Olympic and Paralympic Village, the following measures should be reviewed: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hotel selection • Room layout, zoning in the hotel • Decision on whether to use common spaces (lobbies, lounges, baths, hot springs, etc.) • Designation of pedestrian traffic lanes to facilitate distancing • Formulation of infection prevention measures (for the accommodation owners, staff and guests)
Meals	○ Measures should be taken to prevent infection (e.g. careful selection of places to eat and how to serve food at breakfast, lunch, dinner and supplementary meal times).

<p>Intraregional Transportation</p>	<p>○ Relevant issues with regard to restrictions on intra-regional activities should be specified</p> <p>○ Methods of ensuring the effectiveness of all implemented measures should be discussed going forward.</p> <p>○ For infection control measures during stays, industry-specific guidelines prepared by accommodation facilities, meals, facilities, competition groups, etc., should be referenced. These will also be stipulated in the municipal reception manuals to ensure consistency with the Organising Committee's infection prevention measures in the Olympic and Paralympic Villages.</p> <p>○ With regard to use of the Olympic and Paralympic Village, the following measures should be taken:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identification of areas of activity and facilities to be used during athletes' stay • Formulation of measures required for those coming into contact with athletes • Dissemination and thorough implementation of measures to prevent athletes' infection • Establishment of restrictions on activities to meet the conditions for relaxation of immigration restrictions and the conditions set by the Organising Committee • Health check and recording of athletes' movements • Formulation of countermeasures in the event of unexpected transportation needs and other activities (handling of any injuries by hospitals, for example) <p>○ Regarding media restrictions, rules governing the interviewing of athletes and similar activities should be set based on Olympic/Paralympic Village regulations (identification of the location, limitations on the number of persons and length of time, etc.)</p>
<p>Medical care</p>	<p>○ A system for cooperation between public health centers, medical institutions and recipient municipalities should be established, and rules for sharing information among relevant organizations should be agreed upon.</p> <p>○ Policies governing the response to cases (or suspected cases) of infection should be established (securing consultation and medical examination facilities for suspected cases, administrative testing, beds and accommodation facilities, preparation of transportation methods, etc.).</p> <p>○ Rules for external disclosure of information should be formulated in coordination with the NOC of the partner country or region, the national government, the Organising Committee, etc.</p>
<p>Testing</p>	<p>○ Detailed study should take place going forward on matters including frequency of testing in Host Towns and pre-Games training camp sites and ensuring both an appropriate testing system and health and medical procedures to be applied upon a positive test result. Appropriate measures should be taken to prevent infection among members of the public who have not been subject to testing.</p>
<p>Others / Notes</p>	<p>○ Regardless of whether teams of NOCs, NPCs, NFs or other athletes participating in the Games work individually with universities and companies in Japan to conduct pre-Games training camps, they are requested to cooperate with the municipality where the facilities are located and to take all necessary measures. In this case, the host university or company shall prepare a manual in accordance with municipal reception manual guidelines.</p> <p>○ Summarize the particular points to be considered when accepting Paralympic athletes and describe them.</p> <p>○ A system to share information (regular reporting, communication in case of changes to travel routes, etc.) between Host Towns, prefectures, the Organising Committee, and the Secretariat of the Headquarters for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games, Cabinet Secretariat should be established.</p> <p>○ Establishment of a consultation service and necessary support should be considered.</p>
